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### PERFORMANCE RECORD

#### **FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTS**

The Fund delivered 0.28% in the month of April 2023, which was outperforming the benchmark by 6bps and delivered 2.65% in the 12-months period ending 28 April 2023, outperforming the benchmark by 16bps.

Malaysia's headline inflation decelerated for the seventh straight month as it came in at +3.4% in March (from 3.7% in February; Consensus: 3.6%). March's reading represented the weakest inflation rate since June 2022. The moderation was primarily driven by slower increase in prices for food and non-alcoholic beverages. In addition to this, the price pressures for housing and utilities also softened. Malaysia's Industrial Production Index (IPI) improved to 3.6% YoY in February after recording a modest growth of only 1.8% YoY in January. The expansion in February was spearheaded by the manufacturing sector which rose by 4.9% and the electricity sector which rose by 1.1%. However, the mining sector output declined marginally by 0.5% in February after registering positive growth for 8 consecutive months. Malaysia's total trade in March declined -1.6% YoY to RM237.2 billion amid a contraction in both exports and imports with major trading partners. Exports were down by -1.4% YoY while imports declined by -1.8% YoY. For Q12023, trade grew 3.2% to RM644.9 billion compared to Q12022. However, Malaysia's trade surplus in March widened to RM26.69bil, its highest on record for the month. There was a decline across Malaysia's exports by sector in March. The decline was partially offset by higher exports of petroleum products, optical and scientific equipment as well as machinery, equipment and parts.

We limit our investment exposure to short-term deposit placements due to the very low risk nature of the Fund.
