#### FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTS

- Global fixed income market continued to rally in January 2023, driven by waning uncertainties amidst signs of slowing global growth and softening inflation. Market sentiment continues to improve due to optimism that the current monetary policy hiking cycle by global central banks are nearing the end. US Treasury yields rallied during the month.
- The Chinese property sector saw contracted sales from top developers fall 32% y-o-y in January. However, we will likely see improvements as talks of new supportive policies continue. China's government is drafting a comprehensive action plan to aid developers in the financing and managing of debts.
- Adani Group saw a plunge between 6-16 points in its bonds following a published report by US firm Hindenburg Research which alleged the improper use of offshore tax havens as well as concerns of high debt. Global rating agencies mentioned that ongoing developments will likely reduce the group's ability to raise cash, whilst S&P took negative rating action by revising Adani Ports and Adani Electricity Mumbai's outlooks to negative
- Malaysian bonds rallied during the month in line with lower UST yields and after BNM's MPC delivered a surprise
  pause during its January meeting. The MPC decided to pause and monitor effects of the past 100bps hike, a cautious
  approach on the back of rising risk of a global recession. 10-year ended the month lower at 3.81% (-28 bps).

#### STRATEGY:

- The bond market has stabilized, with markets now pricing in a pause in the Fed's rate hike cycle in 1Q2023. In order to capitalize on this, the Fund is looking to lengthen duration in 1H2023. Bond valuations have become attractive. Actively deploying cash back into good quality Investment Grade credits with 5-7% yields.
- The positioning of the Fund is underweight High Yield, as we expect a slowdown in global growth could lead to more liquidity and credit rating downgrade pressures. The Fund is also underweight the China property sector despite better policy support, as property sales will take a while to recover and liquidity and funding remains challenging.
- We also look to increase the Fund's exposure to the MYR bond market as yields are quite attractive after the correction in 2021-2022, and to reduce USD exposure as we expect USD to underperform in 2023.
- While market sentiment has improved, our cautious stance remains at this juncture with cash level was kept at around 12% and a continued focus on quality. Duration positioning remains short at around 4.3 years amidst prevailing uncertainties and market volatility. The current fixed income yield is at 7.5%.

Default risk relates to the risk of an issuer of the Investment either defaulting on payments or failing to make payments in a timely manner which will in turn adversely affect the value of the Investment. This could adversely affect the value of the target fund.
Interest rate risk	This risk refers to the impact of interest rate changes on the valuation of bonds or money market instruments ("Investment"). When interest rates rise, the investment prices generally decline and this may lower the market value of the Investment. The reverse may apply when interest rates fall.
Currency risk	As the Investments of the target fund may be denominated in currencies other than the base currency, any fluctuation in the exchange rate between the base currency and the currencies in which the investments are denominated may have an impact on the value of these investments. Investors should note that any gains or losses arising from the fluctuation in the exchange rate may further increase or decrease the returns of the investment.

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Structured products risk	The NAV of the target fund will be impacted by the valuation of the structured product. Factors that may impact the valuation of the structured products will include, but not be limited to movement of the underlying assets, volatility of the underlying assets, interest rate levels, the correlation of the underlying assets and other such factors. Any change in the aforesaid factors would either positively or negatively impact the valuation of the structured products, hence impacting the NAV of the target fund. Country risk	Investments of the target fund in any country may be affected by changes in economic and political climate, restriction on currency repatriation or other developments in the law or regulations of the countries in which the target fund invests. For example, the deteriorating economic condition of such countries may adversely affect the value of the investments undertaken by the target fund in those affected countries. This in turn may cause the NAV of the target fund or prices of units to fall.
Regulatory risk	The investments of the target fund would be exposed to changes in the laws and regulations in the countries the target fund is invested in. These regulatory changes pose a risk to the target fund as it may materially impact the investments of the target fund. In an effort to manage and mitigate such risk, the fund manager seeks to continuously keep abreast of regulatory developments (for example, by closely monitoring announcements on regulators' website and mainstream media) in that country. The fund manager may dispose its investments in that particular country should the regulatory changes adversely impact the investors' interest or diminish returns to the target fund.
