#### PERFORMANCE RECORD

The Fund feeds into AHAM Select Asia (ex Japan) Quantum Fund ("target fund") with the objective of achieving capital appreciation over the medium to long-term by investing in Asia (ex Japan) equities with market capitalization of not more than USD1.5 billion at the time of investment. However, the target fund would also have an option to invest into companies with a market capitalization of not more than USD3.0 billion at the time of investment, which will be capped at no more than 30% of the Net Asset Value (NAV) of the target fund.

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### **FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTS**

- In Asia, the MSCI Asia ex-Japan index rallied 6.90% supported by lower bond yields. Taiwan and Korea spearheaded gains with their respective country equity benchmark gauges rising by 9.00% and 11.30% respectively, as foreign inflows swelled.
- China equities saw support with the MSCI China index notching gains of 2.30% as a widely anticipated meeting between China's President Xi Jinping and US President Joe Biden boosted sentiment.
- Additionally, China announced additional stimulus measures to support its beleaguered property sector. Regulators have drafted whitelist of 50 developers that would be eligible for a range of financing. Shenzhen also lowered the minimum downpayment requirement for second homes as well as loosened the definition of luxury homes. These adjustments are anticipated to lower transaction costs in the sector.
- While these stimulus measures could offer short-term relief in terms of liquidity, their effectiveness in addressing the underlying issue of weak housing demand remains to be seen. A crucial indicator for long-term recovery will be contract sales in the property sector.
- On the domestic front, the benchmark KLCI gained 0.70% driven by a sustained buying spree from foreign investors. The wrap-up of 3Q'2023 results season yielded mixed results with domestic-driven sectors such as banks, consumer, property and construction outperforming expectations. Conversely, export-oriented sectors like technology and manufacturing delivered softer results.
- In policy news, the Ministry of Investment, Trade, and Industry (MITI) unveiled plans to enforce a 2-year moratorium on new manufacturing licenses for the iron and steel industry. This development could act as a catalyst for existing steel players with reduced competition and lower supply.
- In addition, the government also announced plans to grant a 30-day visa-free travel period for citizens of China and India. The move could provide tailwinds to tourism-related sectors as arrivals ramp-up.

## STRATEGY:

- Over the month, the Fund returned -2.5% vs the benchmark's 7.2%. The fund holds an underweight position relative to the benchmark in Taiwan, Korea and India, which have done well in November.
- Contributors for the month comprised of Andes Technology and Eugene Technology.
- Investors sentiment were positive on Andes following the collaboration announcement with Meta on datacentre Al using RISC-V while Eugene Technology benefitted from the memory market recovery.
- On to detractors, the fund was negatively affected by a weaker than expected 3Q results of a Malaysian healthcare name
- A cut in 2023 sales guidance of a Chinese sportswear manufacturer due to weak demand also posed as a drag to the fund over the month.
