PERFORMANCE RECORD

This fund feeds into CIMB Principal Global Titans Fund ("target fund") with the objective to achieve medium to long-term capital gains by investing into the US, Europe and Japan equities while having some Malaysia equities exposure to counter the short-term volatility in the global equities markets.

FUND MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The Fund declined 0.75% for the month, underperforming the benchmark which gained 0.23%. Stock selection in the European fund contributed to the underperformance. Year-to-date ("YTD"), the Fund declined 0.31% while the benchmark gained 0.95%.

US second quarter of 2014 ("2Q14) gross domestic product ("GDP") growth was revised to 4.2% quarter-on-quarter (q-o-q") annualized from the initially reported 4%. Japan's 2Q14 GDP fell 6.8% q-o-q annualized, in line with expectations, more than offsetting the 6% expansion in the first quarter of 2014 ("1Q14"). It was its weakest performance since

the March 2011 earthquake disaster. The April VAT hike was clearly the key driver of the contraction as consumer spending fell 4.6%. However, recent consumer spending data suggest that the third quarter ("Q3") growth could bounce up. Also, the GDP deflator rose 2% over a year ago, the largest increase since 1992, indicating some traction on the inflation front. Europe contributed to downside risks for the global economy. 2Q14 Economic and Monetary Union ("EMU") aggregate GDP was flat. Germany contracted for the first since 2013 and Italy contracted a second successive quarter while French GDP was flat for a second quarter in succession. Spain's economy provided a bright spot, with GDP rising 0.6%.

We continue to remain broadly constructive on global equity markets in general, and European equity markets in particular on the basis of free cash flows, high profit margins, and slow but steady improvements in global growth trends. As for Japan and the US, we

continue to overweight stocks with improving business fundamentals, rising investor expectations and attractive relative valuations. The Fund is positioned as neutral across all the three developed markets.
